Yarndale Make Along with Emma Easter Egg Cosy

Emma's crochet pattern will help you create a simple, yet incredibly versatile, cotton cloth.

Not only environmentally friendly, this cloth is practical, durable, easy to wash and can be used as a dishcloth or as a facecloth.

Emma's pattern is suitable for beginners.

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Make Along with Emma

Easter Egg Cosy

Using any DK weight yarn (approximately 7g) and a 3.5mm crochet hook.
A kitchen fork and a tapestry needle.

UK Crochet terms

ch = chain

tr = treble crochet

ss = slip stitch

st = stitch

Round 1. To start make a magic ring and ch 3 (counts as your first tr), then work 11 tr into the ring. Join with a ss into the top of the ch 3 at the beginning of the round. (12sts) Stitches are now worked into the top of the stitches from the previous round.

Round 2. Almost the same as the first round. ch 3 and then work 11 tr. Join with a ss into the top of the ch 3 at the beginning of the round. (12sts)

Round 3. ch 3 then work 1 tr into the base of the ch 3. Work 1 tr into the top of the next st then 2 tr into the top of the next st and repeat this pattern around your circle as follows *1 tr, 2 tr*. Join with a ss into the top of the ch 3 at the beginning of the round. (18sts)

Round 4. The same as Round 3 but still increasing so you'll have even more stitches. ch 3 then work 1 tr into the base of the ch 3. Work 1 tr into the top of the next st then 2 tr into the top of the next st and repeat this pattern around your circle as follows *1 tr, 2 tr*. Join with a ss into the top of the ch 3 at the beginning of the round. (27 sts)

Round 5. ch 3 then work 1 tr into the top of each stitch in the previous round. Join with a ss into the top of the ch 3 at the beginning of the round and fasten off. (27 sts)

To finish your egg cosy, make a mini Pom Pom using a Pom Pom maker or a fork.
