YARNDALE

Stitches used in this pattern. UK terms throughout.

sl st (slip stitch)

This is used to join new yarn. Usually at the start of a round. Insert hook into where you are going to slip and yarn over then pull the loop back through the stitch (or chain space) and pull the loop through the loop on your hook.

ch (chain)

Yarn over and pull through loop on the hook. Creates a chain.

dc (double)

Insert hook through stitch, yarn over and pull the loop back through the stitch. You will have 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through both loops on your hook.

Hope Sock Scarf by Emma

Using sock yarn and a 3mm crochet hook.

Emma used one ball of our very own Yarndale WYS Hope Sock Yarn and the scarf was 1 metre long.

UK crochet terms throughout.

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

The Hope Scarf is worked in linen stitch which is basically a repeat of dc and ch. If using Hope Yarn I recommend winding and putting to one side 2 repeats of each colour before you start crocheting the main part of the scarf for the Tiny Bobble fringe.

To start chain 50 and turn.

Row 1. dc in second ch from your hook then *ch 1, skip 1, dc* and repeat *to* to the end of the row finishing with 1dc in last ch. (26 dc in total)
ch 2 and turn (counts as 1 dc).

Row 2. dc in first space of row 1. Then *ch 1, dc in space* to end of row finishing with ch 1 and 1 dc in the top of the last dc of previous row.

ch 2 and turn (counts as 1 dc).

Repeat Row 2 until all yarn is used up or you have reached the required length. Each row has 26 dc where the ch 2 counts as 1 dc. Weave in two ends.

Tiny Bobble Fringe

For the Tiny Bobble fringe you are going to work in dc in a spiral round and round in amigurumi style. Careful counting is needed.

To start make a magic circle (just a slip knot). The first round is worked into the first magic circle.

Round 1. Work 6 dc into the magic circle.

Round 2. Work 2 dc into each dc of Round 1

Round 3 & 4. Work 1 dc into each dc of the previous round. That's 24 stitches and this is the part where you just need to count.

Round 5. *Skip 1 stitch, dc into next stitch* repeat 6 times. Cut yarn and pull to close your tiny bobble. Use yarn end to attach to scarf
